

Bishop's Annual Appeal - In Action

Our parish has been asked to raise \$30, 374.00 for this year's Appeal.

16 pledges have been submitted by St. Joseph Calasanctius parish as of November 13, 2024 for a total of \$6975.00. This is only 23% of our parish goal. In order to help with your parish fundraising, the parishes who have exceeded their parish goal will receive 25% payback of their exceeded amount received. These rebates will be given even if the Diocesan goal has not been reached.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE FOR CATHOLICS IN CANADA

Decree No. 8 from the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB): In accordance with the prescriptions of canon 1253, the CCCB decrees that the days of fast and abstinence in Canada are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fridays are days of abstinence [from meat], but Catholics can substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day.

What does this mean?

Canon 1249 reminds all Catholics of their obligation to do penance; this obligation comes from the divine law itself. However, to be joined in a common observance of penance, penitential days are prescribed in which the faithful in a special way pray, exercise works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their responsibilities more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence from meat.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence in Canada.

All persons who have completed their <u>fourteenth year of</u> <u>age are bound by the law of abstinence</u>. Those who have completed their <u>eighteenth year of age are bound by the law of fasting up to the beginning of their sixtieth year.</u>

Fridays are penitential days. However, instead of observing the universal law of abstinence from meat on Fridays, Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day. The decree of the Episcopal Conference does not specify which particular acts of piety or charity are to be performed on Fridays; this is left to each Catholic to determine.

In virtue of Canons 87 and 88, the diocesan bishop may dispense from all or some of the specific provisions of this decree, if by so doing he would contribute to the spiritual well-being of the faithful.

Likewise, according to Canon 1245, the pastor in individual cases can dispense from the obligation to fast and abstain from meat on the appointed days or can commute the obligation to other pious works.



DEVELOPMENT & PEACE BoliviaBolivia is one of the countries that we are focusing on this year. It is

a country in Central America with varied terrain spanning the Andies Mountains, the Atacama Desert, and the Amazon Basin Rainforest. Two-thirds of the population is indigenous. Because Bolivia has the second-largest reserves of natural gas in South America, there is a tension over the exploration and export of the resource among indigenous groups. In addition to natural gas and oil, Bolivia has an abundant resource of gold, silver, zinc, tin and copper. Bolivia is one of the world's largest producers of cocoa, and is farmed by Bolivia's poorest farmers which is often the only source of income.

In different parts of the country, they produce and harvest coffee, bananas, yucca, grapes, olives, rice, and sugar cane.

Peace and Development resolve between now and 2030 to end poverty and hunger, to combat inequalities, to build a peaceful, just, and inclusive society in Bolivia
